- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

Before mobility

- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

For the implementation of **STA/STT**-nobilities, – incoming staff is required to get confirmation of invitation by an NCU contact person from the respective faculty in reasonable advance in order to prepare a satisfactory programme of teaching/training.

- Selected Erasmus+ candidates will receive the information about the University in general, its facilities and resources, as well as the information concerning their study at GSU (study programme, contact details of International Affairs Department staff members, scientific supervisors and other relevant information). Correspondent representatives of Francisk Skorina Gomel State University will contact representatives of the sending University who are in charge of mobility actions and discuss all the terms and conditions concerning the candidates mobility. Information about the available academic possibilities, specialities, terms of admission will be presented. From its turn, the sending University will indicate the number of the students concerned. Upon reaching the agreement the core information will be transfer to the correspondent GSU faculty (in case of student mobility) or department (in case of staff mobility) for programme development, assignment of supervisors, specification of academic time, means of control, etc. The acquired information will be again transfered to NCU in Toruń and negotiated. Accommodation, expenses, visa details will be negotiated as well. All the required documents will be prepared. If necessary, International Affairs Department will assist the incoming students in issuing visas (preparing applications to relevant embassies and consular departments), preparing documents for registration.
- Upon their arrival the incoming students and staff members will receive assistance in preparing documents required for organization of study or training process (it will be communicate to them in advance, before their arrival, what type of documents they need to bring from home university), registration at the territory of the Republic of Belarus, medical survey.
- During their stay the incoming students and staff members will be assigned advisors and teachers. GSU employees (deans, staff members of International Affairs Department) are always eager to provide the incoming students and staff members with consultations concerning they stay at the University and in the Republic of Belarus in general.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 5 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

This agreement can be terminated at any time by mutual consent. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September of one given year will only take effect as of 1 September of the next year. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

G. Information

1. Grading Scale at the Nicolaus Copernicus University: The following scale is used for all types of evaluations/examinations:

NCU follows the ECTS scheme, which mean that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education field is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst mark. Moreover, students can also be marked with additional sign of +. It means half of point.
