- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

The incoming student and staff is required to have a valid visa from the nearest Ethiopian Embassy/consular or visa on arrival.

# 4. Termination of the agreement

#### G. Information

## 1. Grading systems of the institutions

[It is recommended that receiving institutions provide the statistical distribution of grades according to the descriptions in the ECTS users' guide<sup>7</sup>. A link to a webpage can be enough. The table will facilitate the interpretation of each grade awarded to students and will facilitate the credit transfer by the sending institution.]

#### At PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst. Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain zal. or zaliczenie (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.

# At Addis Ababa University

The Addis Ababa University University follows a Credit Hour System, which means that credit hours are allocated to the course units, lectures, practical/laboratory works, etc. at each faculty/college/departements. In the Credit Hours System, 1 Cedit hour represents one 1 lecture hour per week of study (in terms of weekly workload); normally 2-4 credit hours per week are given for one course. The Ethiopian academic year starts from first week of September and ends at the last week of June, and the courses are distributed over two semesters per academic years. The distribution of the courses and its credit hours by semesters varies depending on the program/departments. The courses of one academic year are distributed over two semesters.. The duration of one semester is five months including examination and semester breaks.

The Ethiopian grading system in higher education is a letter grade denoted by "A - F", which is based on the 4 to 0 scale, respectively; where 4 is the best mark denoted by a letter "A" and 0 is the worst or unsatisfactory/fail denoted by a letter "F" (see Table below).

Moreover, students' grade can also be marked with additional signs of + and -, to indicate an outstanding score and marginal score to that scale, respectively; i.e.  $A^+$  for outstanding grade of A and  $A^-$  for low score of A. However, the signs of + and - do not have any additional scale values.
