Related to outgoing students (PL TORUN1 as a sending institution):

The PL TORUN1's Erasmus+ Incoming and Outgoing Students Coordinator should submit application of the selected candidates to the receiving institution's coordinator (Student Affairs Section of Graduate School of Humanities, Graduate School of Intercultural Studies or Faculty of Global Human Sciences) within the deadline specified in E1 (Calendar).

The student application should consist of the following documents:

- Exchange Student Application Form
- a copy of passport,
- Purpose of Study Abroad & Study Plan,
- Curriculum Vitae (Free format)
- Application for Certificate of Eligibility (COE),
- Financial Statement (Translated into English),
- a copy of JLPT certificate or Proof of Japanese Language Level (Optional),
- candidate's Transcript of Records
- Certificate of Enrolment
- four photos (30mm×40mm).

Please submit the photos that fit the specified size and the requirements as these will be printed on the COE and an official resident card.

At Kobe University the exchange of students under the Erasmus+ Programme will in principle be conducted in accordance with the terms of the Agreement for Student Exchange. Accordingly, incoming students from Nicolaus Copernicus University to Kobe University will have the same status as a normal exchange student. However, Kobe University will not count the number of exchange students from Nicolaus Copernicus University under the Erasmus+ Programme towards the student quotas for the normal exchange programme. Exchange under the Erasmus+ programme is conducted among relevant faculties separately from the normal exchange agreement programme.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 2 months
- 3. All mobility can be started from the day of signature and should be accomplished by July 31st, 2021.

Transcript of Records

A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 2 months after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI, given that the transcript form and all relevant course work documents have been submitted by the student.

Termination of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.
