Inter-institutional¹ agreement 2016-2021² between institutions from programme and partner countries

[Minimum requirements]³

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

The higher education institution agrees to:

- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

The higher education institution located in a partner country of Erasmus further undertakes to:

Before mobility

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. The institution from the Partner country should inform mobile participants of cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided. Costs for insurance can be covered with the organisational support grants. See the information / insurance section for contact details.
- Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation. See the information / housing section for contact details.

During and after mobility

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and
 incoming mobile participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the
 institution's everyday life, and have in place appropriate mentoring and support
 arrangements for mobile participants as well as appropriate linguistic support to
 incoming mobile participants.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.

- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

 institution/not by NCU.

F. Calendar

1. Applications and information on nominated students must reach the receiving institution by:

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within four weeks, if all documentation is included.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued (but not sent) by the receiving institution no later than five weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement
- This agreement will take effect on the 2016-2017 academic year and it will be valid until the 2021 2022 academic year. Either institution is free to terminate the present agreement. In order to do so, the institution wishing to terminate the agreement must do so in writing of its intention, by giving at least 6 months notice, stating the date on which it intends to make the termination effective. The other party must reply within 30 days. At the end of such period, if no reply has been forwarded, it will be deemed that both parties agree and that the proposal for termination is accepted. The termination of the agreement will not be penalized.
- Should this agreement be terminated, neither party will be held responsible for any economic loss or otherwise resulting from such termination. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
- If a student or staff has started the exchange experience at either university at the date of of termination, he or she will be able to complete the stay.

G. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

The table will facilitate the interpretation of each grade awarded to students and will facilitate the credit transfer by the sending institution.]

At PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.orzaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.

Boise State University's Grading System

Boise State University uses a 4.0 grading scale. The table below lists the letter grades that instructors use to document their evaluation of your work and to document your academic status in the class. In addition, it defines the meaning of each letter grade and specifies the number of quality points that correspond to each grade.

Quality points are used to determine your grade-point average (GPA).

*For students on exchange, ECTS credits are divided by 2, to determine the US credits. For example, 30 ECTS credits = 15 US credits.
