Inter-institutional¹ agreement 2019-20[23]² between institutions from programme and partner countries

[Minimum requirements]3

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

D. Respect of fundamental principles and other mobility requirements

The higher education institution agrees to:

- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

The higher education institution located in a **partner country** of Erasmus further undertakes to:

Before mobility

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency.

- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. The institution from the Partner country should inform mobile participants of cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided. Insurance coverage is not provided by UCI for incoming mobile participants. Costs for insurance can be covered with the organisational support grants. - Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation. See the information / housing section for contact details.

During and after mobility

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and
 incoming mobile participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the
 institution's everyday life, and have in place appropriate mentoring and support
 arrangements for mobile participants as well as appropriate linguistic support to
 incoming mobile participants.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions
 with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a
 full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility
 period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

E. Any additional requirements

The mobilities involve only non-clinical, non-research activities and no patient care, patient evaluation, or patient management.

The receiving institution reserves the right to dismiss any incoming mobile participant for academic or personal misconduct in violation of established regulations and policies. Incoming mobile participants are to comply with the rules, regulations, and restrictions of the receiving institution.

Mobile participants and/or their sending institutions are responsible for any expenses related to the mobility that are not covered by the Erasmus+ Programme funding. Such expenses may include but are not limited to: passport and visa fees; airfare; housing; meals; local transportation and parking; health insurance and healthcare; and miscellaneous incidentals.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [x] weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [xx] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement

Either party may terminate this agreement for any reason upon ninety days' prior written notice to the other party, provided that the parties shall cooperate to ensure mobilities then in progress are terminated in a manner that appropriately protects the rights of mobile participants and provided that the parties reasonably consult when notice of termination is given to the non-terminating party. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

G. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

[It is recommended that receiving institutions provide the statistical distribution of grades according to the descriptions in the ECTS users' guide⁸. A link to a webpage can be enough. The table will facilitate the interpretation of each grade awarded to students and will facilitate the credit transfer by the sending institution.]

At PL TORUN01:

The Nicolaus Copernicus University follows the ECTS scheme, which means that ECTS credits are allocated to course units, lectures, practical works, etc. at each faculty. In ECTS, 60 credits represent one year of study (in terms of workload); normally 30 credits are given for six months (a term/semester).

The Polish grading system in higher education is based on the 5 to 2 scale, where 5 is the best mark and 2 is the worst.

Moreover, students can also be marked with additional signs of + and -. Each of them equals half a point: + means 0.5 more. Some courses, however, are not evaluated on such a marking scheme and for these a student may simply obtain *zal.* or *zaliczenie* (EN. 'pass') which means that their workload was satisfactory and they have passed the course.

H. Amendments

Any changes, additions or other amendments to this Agreement must be made in a writing, signed by the authorized representatives of each party.

I. Indemnification

Each party shall defend, indemnify, and hold the other party, its officers, employees, and agents harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, including attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement, but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury (including death) or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its officers, employees or agents. The party seeking indemnification agrees to provide the other party with prompt notice of any such claim or action and to permit the indemnifying party to defend any claim or action, and to cooperate fully in such defense. The indemnifying party shall not settle or consent to the entry of any judgement in any action, suit or proceeding without the consent of the indemnified party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed.

J. Liability Insurance

Each party shall maintain general liability insurance, property insurance, and automobile liability insurance with responsible and reputable insurance companies or associations, or shall self-insure for same, in amounts that are reasonable and customary for institutions of comparable size and nature and that undertake similar activities, and shall provide written proof of the existence of such coverage to the other party upon request.

K. Export Control

NCU shall cooperate with UCI to the extent necessary for UCI to ensure that the activities resulting from this agreement comply with United States export control laws and regulations and University of California export control policies.

L. Use of Name

Neither party may use the name, seal (including the official and unofficial seal) or any other symbol or logo of the other party, until it has sought and received written approval for such use pursuant to the other party's policies and procedures.

M. Dispute Resolution

The Parties shall endeavor to resolve any disputes arising out of or relating to this Agreement amicably by consulting and negotiating with each other, and recognizing their mutual interests, attempting to reach a solution satisfactory to both parties. If the parties fail to resolve a dispute by negotiation, then the laws of the jurisdiction where the defendant has its principal place of business shall control this Agreement and any document to which it is appended, without regard to any conflict of law principles that would result in the application of any law other than the laws of the jurisdiction where the defendant has its principal place of business. The exclusive jurisdiction and venue for any and all actions arising out of or brought under this Agreement is in a court of competent jurisdiction, situated in the jurisdiction where the defendant has its principal place of business.
